Location:

The ORSA is located just west of Oak Ridge, Tennessee on state route 95 (Oak Ridge Turnpike) and address is 2625 Oak Ridge Turnpike, Oak Ridge, TN 37830.

Facilities:

The match will be fired at our Competition Range that can accommodate 24 competitors on covered firing points. There is ample parking adjacent to the firing line. Running water is available as well as restrooms. We recommend that you bring lunch, drinks, and snacks as there are no snack or restaurant facilities at ORSA.

Lodging:

Motels are located in nearby Oak Ridge, Tennessee, which is approximately four miles east of the range. There you will also find many restaurant and numerous fast food restaurants.

Rules:

Current [American Smallbore Shooting Association](#) Rifle Rules will govern. The .22 Caliber Rimfire Rifle as defined in ASSA Smallbore Rifle Rules 1.1.2 (Any Rifle) applies. Per Rule 2.13, the requirement for a smallbore empty chamber indicator (ECI) to indicate that the chamber is empty will be strictly enforced.

Eligibility: Open to all competitors, membership in the ASSA is not required but encouraged. The "State Champion" must be a resident of the state of Tennessee and a member of TNSSA.

SR-1 Card:

SR-1 card is not required, providing a complete and correct entry form (attached) is submitted.

Entries Limited:

Entries are limited to 48 individual competitors.

Advance entries will be accepted up to range capacity, based on earliest postmarks. Entries beyond range capacity will be notified by email or telephone on, or about, April 21st.

Post Entries:

Post entries will be accepted up to the stated range capacity. There is no additional fee for post entries by advanced entries are appreciated.

Entry Fees:

2-Day 3200 Package – Incl. ASSA reg. fee and all matches \$60.00

1-Day 1600 Package – Incl. ASSA reg. fee and all matches \$40.00

Junior 3200 Package – Incl. ASSA reg. fee and all matches \$25.00

Junior 1600 Package – Incl. ASSA reg. fee and all matches \$17.00

Note: One day entries are not eligible for any grand aggregate awards.

Return of Fees:

Advance entry fees will be fully refunded to any competitor unable to attend if notified by phone or email 7 days before event takes place. Cancellations received after seven days before the event, will be refunded at 50% of entry fee. Cancellations after April 30th will receive no refunds.

Squadding:

All matches, including team matches, will be squadded by the Statistical Office. All competitors must check in at the Statistical Office, located in Indoor Range, to obtain squadding tickets. A competitor squadding report for individual matches will be posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board on Saturday morning prior to Match No. 1.

Failure of a competitor to obtain his squadding ticket or to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called, may lose his right to compete in that event. Post entries (or advance entries whose classification could not be verified online) may be asked to present classification cards at time of registration.

Squadding preference will be given to full program entries.

Classification:

The ASSA classification system will be used in all individual matches. Individual competitors without an ASSA classification or alternative proof of skill will fire in the Master Class.

Categories and Awards:

Separate awards may be given in each of the following categories, individual match winner, High Junior, High Master, High Expert, High Sharpshooter, High Marksman, High Senior, and State Champion. No awards will be given if less than five shooters are entered in a class or category. Classes and categories may be combined (Rule 18.2.1.7.1).

Targets:

Official NRA Conventional targets will be used: A-23 at 50 yards, A-25 at 100 Yards, and A-26 at 50 meters. Competitors will mark and hang their own targets before each match stage. Target clips are required and must be furnished by each competitor. Targets will be scored by the Statistical Office staff under the supervision of the Chief Statistical Office. Scored targets will be available for inspection by competitors in the Statistical Office.

Challenges:

Challenges and protests will be addressed as described in Rule 16. A \$2.00 challenge fee will be charged for each challenge and collected by the Statistical Office before making the first recheck. The fee will be returned if the challenge is sustained at any point along the line of rechecks. Challenge time limits for each match will be posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board.

Scoring of challenged shots and shots of questionable value:

In this tournament, the plug type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by the range operating personnel including range officers, chief statistical officer, and one or more of the three members of the jury, who will be selected prior to firing time.
