**MATCH INFORMATION**

**ELIGIBILITY**

The Intercollegiate Rifle Club National Championships are open to individuals and teams whose members represent any one college, junior college or university, provided each member is eligible for participation in intercollegiate competition under the rules of the institution. The following rules apply to eligibility:

4.6.2.5. Collegiate 4.6.2.5.1. Undergraduate students that maintain a minimum of twelve (12) credits per semester or the equivalent in a two-year or four-year institution and have not received a Bachelor’s degree. 4.6.2.5.2. Collegiate eligibility is for four (4) years over a total period of five (5) years starting upon attendance of the first class as a full-time student. The five (5) year rule may be extended due to military service that lasts for more than two (2) consecutive months.

For this match only - Collegians must be full-time during all semesters in which they compete; except for their final semester which may be less than 12 hours. If a collegian goes to graduate school directly after graduation from undergraduate school, and has one, or more, year(s) of eligibility left, the graduate student may compete (and complete their four years of eligibility) in their first year of graduate school.

Each competitor firing in the individual matches will pay an entry fee of \$45.00 per match event to the ASSA. Each team will pay \$50.00 per match event to the ASSA. Payment is due no later than April 2, 2021. Online entry and payments can be made at the ASSA Web page for this event. Checks should be mailed to PO Box 855, Latrobe PA 15650. Make checks payable to the American Smallbore Shooting Association.

### **REGISTRATION/SQUADDING**

Registration for all teams and individuals attending the Championship must be submitted by Friday March 26, 2021. Please provide all required information on the registration form for each participant so that the electronic targets and squadding can be completed before the match. Squadding will be determined by the statistical officer.

Team entries must be completed prior to 7:30am April 10, 2021. Entries will be made on a form provided by the statistical office. Teams will use the designate 5 and count 4 format for team entries. Five individuals may be designated on the team and the four highest scores will be used to determine the team's score.

### **RANGE WAIVERS**

ASSA and X-Count range waivers must be completed by each competitor prior to firing.

### **RULES**

The 2018 ASSA Smallbore Rifle Rules & 2020 NRA Precision Air Rifle Position Rules will govern the 2021 ASSA Intercollegiate Rifle Club National Championships.

### **EMPTY CHAMBER INDICATORS**

All participants will be required to use empty chamber indicators (ECI'S) for smallbore rifles and a clear barrel indicator (CBI) for air rifles during the matches.

## **COURSE OF FIRE**

**Saturday April 10<sup>th</sup>: Smallbore Rifle:** 3x20 Metric 3-Position, 50 feet. Kneeling 30 minutes. 15 Minute Change Over. Prone 20 minutes, 15-minute change over. Standing 40 Minutes, 15 Minute Change Over. A 3-minute preparation period will precede the start of each stage.

**Sunday April 11<sup>th</sup> Air Rifle:** 60 shot standing Precision Air Rifle, 10 meters. 15-minute prep and 75 minutes for record fire.

## **TIES**

Ties will be broken in accordance to the appropriate Rule Book. Air Rifle NRA rule 15.3. Smallbore ASSA rule 11.11.

## **COACHING**

Coaching is not permitted while a competitor is on the firing line.

## **SCORING**

Electronic scoring will be used for all events. All scoring will be done by the MegaLink Target Computer System.

## **CHALLENGES**

All administrative challenges on scores should be directed to the Statistical Officer. Challenge time expires one hour after all scores for each relay are posted. Only Administrative Challenges will be accepted regarding posted scores. Provisional scores will be permitted at the discretion of the Range Officer and the official rules.

## **PROTEST/APPEAL**

A Jury Chairman and Jury will be appointed in accordance with the rules. The decision of the Protest/Appeal Jury is final.

## **SPECIAL ACTIVITIES**

Friday, April 10, 2021

5:00 pm — Range operation procedures, scoring, challenges, and other details will be reviewed and questions will be addressed. Match staff are introduced. (X-Count Range)

## **GUNSMITHING AND AIR**

Compressed air will be available on site. It is recommended each athlete have their own adapter. Anschutz, Walther, Feinwerkbau, Pardini, Crosman Challenger and CZ T200 can be

filled. CO2 is not available. Limited gun smith services will be available as Greg Rice is factory trained on many different types.

- Second Team – The next Five Highest Scoring Individuals (6-10) based on average of this Championship and two highest scores fired during the year in a sanctioned competition.
